

Tip of Tex K-9 Rescue has recently embarked on an innovative partnership to increase the number of animals rescued in South Texas. This partnership also includes local volunteers, veterinarians, and the Humane Society of Boulder Valley.

Due to low levels of animal sterilization in South Texas, there are thousands of unwanted animals euthanized here every year. Through a sustained community effort in which animal adoption and sterilization were promoted, Boulder Colorado has achieved a pet population growth that is below the current demand for adoptions. The Humane Society of Boulder Valley (HSBV) has built on this success by reaching out to other areas of the country and transferring rescued dogs and cats to their facility.

Tip of Tex is proud to be sending 14 puppies and dogs to Boulder on Oct 3 in the first transfer in the series. Two are adult females, three are young adults, and there are nine puppies from three different litters. Most of the dogs came from the pound in Kingsville and are all healthy and extremely adoptable.

The dogs will travel to Houston via automobile and will then get on a direct flight to Denver where they will be met by a representative from HSBV. After the trip to HSBV's facility in Boulder, they will be examined by a vet, receive the remainder of their vaccinations, be sterilized, and finally placed up for adoption. HSBV has also implemented the Meet Your Match™ program in which a dog's behavior, friendliness, playfulness, energy level, and motivation are assessed and categorized in order to help it find a successful, permanent placement.

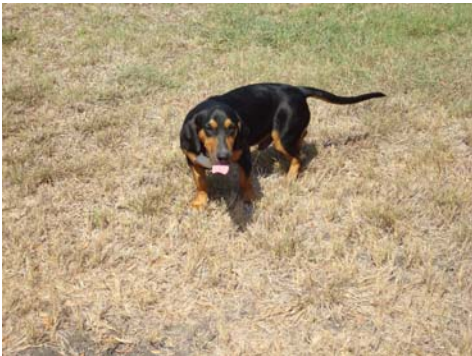
